Historical Light

The cover art for this Trestleboard is a sample page from a ritual cypher that uses an entirely different set of symbols from what we use in NJ today.

There were two main cypher systems in common use in the US starting in the 1870's. The cypher system we use was originally the system used in a series titled *King Solomon and his Followers*, published by Allen Publishing in NY, later acquired by McCoy's. This page is from the competing *Ecce Orienti* cypher (Latin for *Look to the East*). In order to misdirect cowans, the book pretended to be a ritual of a fictitious Modern Order of Essenes, not masons.

The first 14 pages of the book contained a supposed history of that group. Finally in the middle of page 14 the actual masonic opening ceremony begins. This is not a NJ opening, but close enough that you can get the idea. My attempted translation follows:

WM. The brethren will be clothed and the officers repair to their stations. Brother SW satisfy yourself that all present are Master Essenes.

SW. I am satisfied worshipful that all present are Master Essenes.

WM. Call the brethren to order as such (*rsv?*) yourself that they are.

SW. Brethren come to order as Master Essenes (*probably stand giving dg. & sn. & hold sn. of fidelity*) W.M. (X means rap to seat lodge) Brother JD, what is the first care of a lodge of Master Essenes? ID. To see that the lodge is tyled Worshipful.

At first this cypher seems quite cumbersome to use, but only because we are used to something different. This standing to order as masons during opening is typical of English lodges, so it is no surprise that it is also done somewhere in US lodges as well.
