Memorization of ritual, while conducive to good productions, does not define or set aside one brother from another.

Knowing verse does not define a successful mason wholly. A "good" Mason is made in his heart. He is neither covetous nor envious of his brother Masons. He conducts himself with honor, dignity, and compassion for his fellow man. His mind is open and

inquiring, not narrow and focused on one particular aspect of life or beliefs.

A "good" Mason will offer to help a struggling brother. If he sees someone who is needing support in his daily life, or who is fighting a challenge that threatens to upend or alter his life, he helps without question. A "good" Mason would never sit back and allow a brother

to fail in his mission.
