For years I have sat in lodge and listened to the requests from various worthy organizations for monetary donations to help their cause. More times than not, members stand up, make a motion to help that organization and the lodge votes to do this. Sometimes it becomes so standard that we don't even think about what we are doing. I also sat in a lodge, watched the vote, and then overheard a brother ask his neighbor, "What did we just vote for?"; I am not advocating that we stop this. These are worthy causes that need our assistance. However, as they always say, "charity begins at home"; I consider the lodge my extended family and my home away from home. It is only right that we should look inward when we are looking for places to help. With all the places to give of yourself, I hope that you can be as satisfied as I am when it comes to helping our lodge.

Brethren, some time ago, the lodge voted to stay in its current location and proceed on a "path to success" which involves developing membership and changing operations to make us more financially viable for the continued future of the lodge. Membership is off to a great start with three new EA's initiated and one potential candidate to be voted on shortly. I charge each and every one of you to welcome our new members and ensure we show them the quality lodge we all know and love. I also charge you to continue this momentum so we can fill our lodge as we have in the past.

On the financial front we are doing ok. We have taken a hard look at our expenses and cut everything that can be cut without severely affecting our operations. Unfortunately, many of our expenses such as insurance and utilities are outside our direct control. On the income side, the lodge voted for only a minimal increase in dues which barely covered our loss in membership over the past year. It seems the membership present would rather look at other means of income other than putting the burden on all the membership. Our rentals continue to outpace our budgeted estimate, which I am cautiously optimistic about.

The last piece of our income equation is fundraisers. We have just held a somewhat successful Fisherman's breakfast. Even though we made a little bit of profit, which is positive for our first time in years trying this, we really didn't have a strong support from the lodge other than the members who came and worked. Soon we are trying to run a couple more fundraisers and will need a lot more active support from the membership. Without it we will either fail or marginally succeed but burn out those who continue to support the programs.

Brethren, this is not my lodge; it is our lodge. We all need to do our part to make the lodge a success. Without the support of each and every member, I hate to image what the future may hold. As Brother Franklin once said "We must all hang together, or we will surely hang separately." While its meaning today is not as literal as when it was said, there is still some truth to that quote.

I hope to see of all soon in lodge and at our future events. If there is anything I can do to help you help the lodge, let me know.
